

The students learn important concepts through a strengthening and imagination-building movement activity. We listened to a song called "Car Wash." First we pretended to wash our imaginary cars, using prepositions (inside, under, on top, on the side, etc.) Prepositions are concept words children need to know to successfully participate in classroom activities and assignments. Students lie down on the floor to wash UNDER the car. Prepositions describe spatial location, the relationship between two or more things, and direction; making understanding them crucial to school success.
