

If You Give A Pig A Pancake

Pig



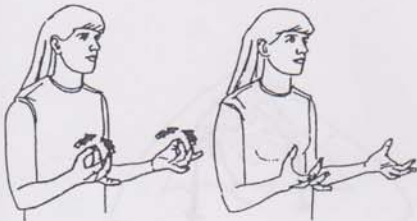
PANCAKE (pān' kāk'), n. (Turning over a pancake.) The open right hand rests on the upturned left palm. The right hand flips over and comes to rest with its back on the left palm. This is the action of turning over a pancake.



SYRUP (sir' əp), n. (Wiping the mouth and pouring) The upturned right index sweeps across the mouth from right to left. The hand then forms the "7" shape, and pivots over so that the thumb represents left arm.



Sticky



toy

Shake T hands.

bath

Rub A hands up and down on your chest, as if cleaning yourself.



closet

Hang an X hand on the index finger of your other hand and bounce the X down your index finger.



SUITCASE (sūit' kās'), n. (The natural sign.) The downturned right "S" hand grasps an imaginary piece of luggage and shakes it up and down slightly, as if testing its weight. Cf. BAGGAGE, LUGGAGE, VALISE.

Farm

With an open right hand the thumb touches the right side of your mouth and then the left.

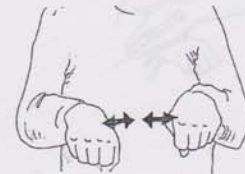


dance

Swing an upside-down V hand over the open palm.

shoes

Tap S hands together.



bed

Lay your cheek on your hands.



music/sing/song

Place your right hand back and forth over your left forearm.



keyboard/piano

Wiggle your fingers along an imaginary keyboard.

Picture

n. (The natural sign.) The eye peers through the viewfinder of an imaginary camera, and the index finger clicks the shutter. This sign is used for a camera of the 35-mm type.

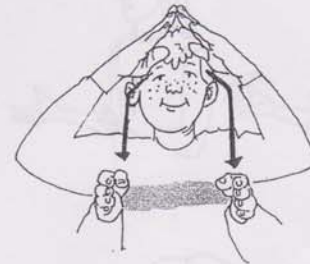


m.l. 1 (mäl), n. (The stamp is affixed.) The right thumb is placed on the tongue, and is then pressed to the open left palm. *Cf.* LETTER.



tree

Rest the elbow of your upright right arm on your left palm and twist your arm back and forth a few times. You can sign forest by moving your arms to the right while you sign tree.



house

Form the roof and sides of a house with your hands.

D (wöod), n. (The sawing of wood.) The little edge of the open right hand moves back and in a sawing motion over the back of the down-left left hand. *Cf.* SAW 1.



HAMMER (*häm' ar*), *n., v., -MERED, -MERING.* (The natural sign.) The right hand, grasping an imaginary hammer, swings down toward the left fist, which represents the object being hammered. The right hand does not touch the left, however. The action is usually repeated.



family

Hold the thumbs of your F hands together, then circle your hands around until your pinky fingers touch.
